## TORONTOS WON AFTER OVERTIME

N. H. A. Championship Winners Again Defeat Victorias.

FINAL SCORE WAS 6 TO 5

"Minnie" McGiffin Scored Winning Goal After Fifteen Minutes of Extra Play.

Toronto, March 17.—The Torontos, champions of the National Hockey Association, and Victorias, holders of the Pacific Coast League title, played their second Stanley Cup game at the Arena here tonight. The locals again demonstrated their superiority over the western visitors, but it required fifteen minutes of overtime play to do the trick. The score was 6 to 5.

The game was played under Pacific Coast League rules. These call for seven men on each team, and the loss of the services of a player when penalized. Another and important feature was the new off-side rule in centre ice, which was shown to local fans for the first time. The Victorias had an advantage here and frequently caught the locals forwards off their guard by long passes to another player up the ice. The ice is divided into three equal sections. In the centre space a player may take a pass from a man behind, but in the other two sections the same rules as in the N. H. A. govern.

Victorias Combination Lacking.—Victorias did not produce the great combination plays which it was said they would demonstrate under their own rules. They made many passes, but they were for the most part from one side of the rink. There was none of the three-man play as seen in the Ontario Hockey Association. In the last period Torontos took a liking to the new rule, and made some nice plays, with two men generally waiting to take the pass on the line. They did not, however, have the fast snappy passes of the visitors, who showed that they have perfected the play.

The visitors again lacked the punch to get goals, even though they did score five. Most of their tallies were scored when Torontos were short a player, while the locals touched the majority of theirs while the entire Victoria team was in position. In the last period, Victoria had many good chances with only one man to pass, but preferred to shoot from outside the defence. Dundasdale was the worst offender in this respect. Holmes, who is generally weak on long shots, was not caught napping tonight.

McGiffin Scores Winning Goal.—"Minnie" McGiffin scored the winning goal, after fifteen minutes of extra play. Foyston, Wilson and McGiffin rushed and the former shot. Lindsay made the stop and cleared in front, but McGiffin, by fast footwork, lodged the puck in the corner of the net. Victoria rushed more often than the locals, but as on Saturday night were not as effective when close in on the nets. The Toronto forwards gave their defence good help by consistent back checking. Foyston and Walker were the best in this respect.

Patrick and Genge were again the strongholds of the Victoria team. Patrick had not carried the puck to perfection tonight and seldom made a mistake. Genge tried individual rushes most of the time, and gave the locals much trouble.
