Application To Parliament

Notice is hereby given that an application will be made by the Corporation of the City of London to the Legislature of the Province of Ontario, at its next session.

1. To authorize the Council of the Corporation of the City of London to pass a by-law to borrow, and to borrow, the cost of the paying of the "track allowances" of the London Street Railway Company, done during the year 1923, for any period not exceeding ten years from the date of the issue thereof, at such rate of interest, not exceeding 6 per cent per annum, as the Council of the Corporation of the City of London may determine, without submitting the by-law to or receiving the assent thereof of the electors of the said City of London.

2. To authorize the Council of the Corporation of the City of London to enter into an agreement with the London Street Railway Company to provide for the repayment of the cost of paying the "track allowances" mentioned in the next preceding paragraph hereof, with interest at such rate, and for such term of years, as may be agreed upon.

3. To authorize the Council of the Corporation of the City of London to borrow during the present year and thereafter moneys to pay for the cost of paying the "track allowances" of the London Street Railway Company in the streets or highways being paved or repaved under the provisions of Section 19 of By-law 24 of the City of London, passed on the 21st day of May, A. D. 1923, and of the agreement between the Corporation of the City of London and the London Street Railway Company, bearing date the 6th day of June, A. D. 1923, and from time to time to issue debentures therefor, for any period not exceeding ten years from the date of the issue thereof, and at such rate of interest, not exceeding 6 per cent per annum, as the Council of the Corporation of the City of London may determine, without submitting the by-law to or receiving the assent thereof of the electors of the said City of London.

4. To authorize the directors of the Western Fair Association to issue debentures to an amount not exceeding \$20,000, and to apply the proceeds of the sale thereof in payment of the balance of the cost of the erection, upon part of the Western Fair grounds, in the said City of London, owned by the Corporation of the City of London, of the Manufacturers Building for the said Fair.

5. The said debentures shall be issued for such term of years, not exceeding fifteen years, and shall bear such rate of interest, not exceeding 6 per cent per annum, as the Directors of the said Western Fair Association may deem expedient.

6. To authorize the Council of the Corporation of the City of London, without obtaining the assent of the electors of the said city, to guarantee the debentures mentioned in the next two preceding paragraphs hereof, and the interest payable thereon.

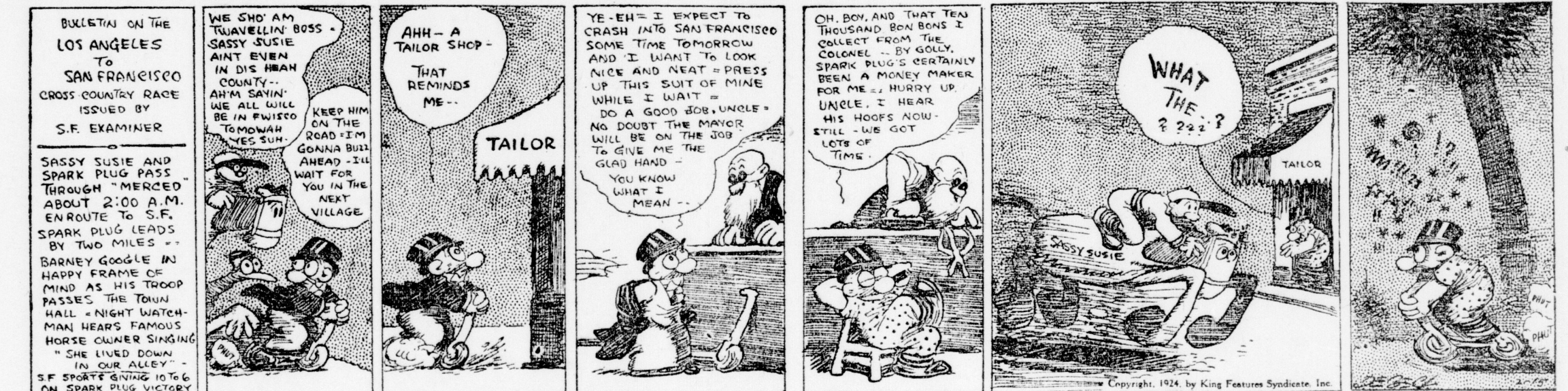
