How to Kill Motes and Disinfect.
I have never, during my 20 years of housekeeping, had a moth of any description, and attribute my immunity entirely to the use of turpentine. After each of my carpets is well swept, it is once gone over with the following mixture: To three quarts of pure turpentine, in this thoroughly saturated a sponge, squeeze about two-thirds dry and go over each breadth separately and in all the corners. As often as the carpet becomes soiled take a fresh sponge. You will be surprised to see how beautifully it will cleanse your carpets, besides being one of the best disinfectants. My father, an eminent physician, had this always practiced in his family, and we were never troubled with fevers any more than most, — Cor. Philadelphia Press.

ITALIAN CREAM. — Rub the seat of two lemons upon three or four lumps of loaf sugar; stir these into a pint of rich cream and add enough sugar to sweeten. Whip the cream with the juice of one lemon, straining in one ounce of gelatine that has been dissolved in milk water. When thoroughly light, pour into a mold and freeze. When served garnish with preserved fruit.

REED TOMATOES. — Select firm ripe tomatos, pare and slice them thick; season with pepper and salt and sprinkle flour over each piece.
