1. The *ciphers* set opposite some nouns, in different parts of this book, mark the order of the plural termination to which each noun belongs ; those terminations being : 1. *ak* ; 2. *ik* ; 3. *ok* ; 4. *k* ; 5. *al* ; 6. *il* ; 7. *ol* , 8. *l*.

It must be observed, however, that the second termination (*ik*) requires always, before its annexation to the noun, the change of the final *a* or *i* into *j* : *Kabhôzil*, prisoner, pl. *Kabhôzijik* ; (*notkuaag*, pilot, pl. *notkuaagik*).

The final letter *w* in *gw*, *kw*, must be suppressed before the annexation of the 7th termination (*ol*).
