

special effort, or general work for the church, school or parsonage, or the collection of money for any parochial or diocesan purpose. The branch shall, in every such case, meet under the usual officers and rules, but shall report to the clergyman and not to the branch of the W.A." Plans for next year's work were made, prominence being given to the "United Thank Offering" for which boxes were distributed. Greetings were received from Toronto and Niagara Dioceses, and letters containing much useful information were sent by the Provincial General Secretary and the Provincial Dorcas Sec. It was decided that it would be better to hold the annual meeting out of the See city, as long as the membership was comparatively small. The invitation from Morrisburg was accepted, subject to the approval of the Bishop and President. The same officers were re-elected, with the exception of the Corresponding Sec., who was obliged to retire, and Mrs. Fitzgerald fills that position. Only one secretary for Junior Branches was elected this year, Miss Paris being chosen. A resolution was passed containing the recommendation that the Junior branches should undertake some definite work, such as the education of a missionary's child. The meetings were brought to a close by addresses from the Bishop and Archdeacon, and by singing the hymn for those at sea.

ST. MARGARET'S CHURCH, JANEVILLE.—The Rev. Mr. Daykin, has infused fresh zeal and life into the work of this pretty little edifice. The Bishop recently held confirmation service which five adults were confirmed. The church has also been the recipient of a number of gifts—two new prayer desks, a handsome brass rail costing over \$100; a new chalice and paten, a new hanging for the lectern. The brass on the re-table has been gilded, and a handsome reredos is shortly to be put up. The congregation is steadily increasing.

F. S. NOTES.—In consequence of representations made at the Associates' meeting last

month, it was agreed to continue the general monthly meetings of the society in St. George's school-room on the first Thursdays in May and June. After the June picnic our meetings will, as usual, be discontinued until September.
