

PRAYERS.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk to return the Bill (178), intituled: "An Act to incorporate the Export Credits Insurance Corporation and to promote the revival of trade by the provision of Dominion Government guarantees to encourage exports from Canada,"

And to acquaint the Senate that they have agreed to the amendments made by the Senate to the said Bill, without any amendment.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk with a Bill (183), intituled: "An Act to Promote the Construction of new Houses, the Repair and Modernization of existing Houses, the improvement of Housing and Living Conditions, and the Expansion of Employment in the Postwar Period," to which they desire the concurrence of the Senate.

The said Bill was read the first time,

With leave of the Senate,

The said Bill was read the first time.

With leave of the Senate,

The Honourable Senator King moved that the said Bill be now read a second time.

The said Bill was, on division, read the second time.
