FOREIGN MISSIONS.

The General Assembly resumed consideration of the report on Foreign Missions interrupted by the adjournment on the evening of Friday last, and again in part disposed of in the morning of to-day, and took up the recommendation of the Committee for the appointment of a Convener of said Committee whose whole time shall be given to the business connected with the administration of this enterprise, and who shall be paid an adequate salary for his services.

It was moved by Dr. MacLaren, seconded by Mr. Hamilton Cassels, That in view of the rapid growth of the Foreign Missions under the care of the Committee, and the vastly increased correspondence and work arising therefrom, the Assembly agrees to take immediate steps to appoint a Convener, or Secretary, whose whole time and services shall be devoted to this department of the Church's work.

It was moved in amendment by Dr. Armstrong, seconded by Mr. George Bruce, That the Foreign Mission Committee be instructed to prepare a statement of reasons for such appointment to be remitted to Presbyteries for their judgment, to report to next General Assembly, and that in the meantime the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) be appropriated for Secretarial work.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Assembly adjourned to meet again at half-past seven o'clock, of which public intimation was given, and the Sederunt was closed with the Benediction.
