army, were more profoundly ignorant of; even the commanding officers of corps were uncertain, at leaving the Oneida ftation, whether they were to be led againft Niagara, Ofwegatchie or Cadaraqui; by which extraordinary fecrecy, the enemy were, beyond doubt, prevented from fuccouring, or reinforcing the garrifon of fort Frontenac. Had the defign been made public, the Indians, who have a conflant intercourfe with those of the enemy, might have given them fuch information, as would have enabled them, by reinforcing the garrifon, to have render'd our attempt abortive.

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As to the fecond point. The expedition and dispatch, with which this enterprize was carried on, is perhaps not exceeded by any recorded in history; for notwithstanding the obstructions we met in Wood Creek, the detention at the Oswego Falls, and our frequent halts on the banks of the Ontario, on account of rough water; we were only ten days on our passage, from Bulls fort to Cadaraqui, the distance being at least two hundred and twenty five miles, which,
