

A Lakeshore Orchard Home-(Trees in Blossom)

Mr. Price writes: "In giving the following figures I wish it to be understood that they are actual results gained in the ordinary way of farming."

The cost of production given by Mr. Price is \$38.00 per acre, arrived at thus:
