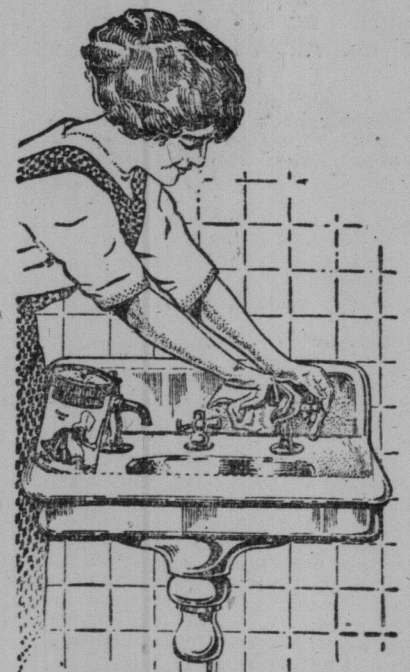
## NEED LARGER OUTLOOK

The archbishop had recently returned from his summer vacation in the receiving homes in Montreal and Quebec, but nowhere, he thought, was there a more homelike air than in the houses just opened in Toronto.
