HOPPER CARS HAVE PROVED SUCCESSFUL

C. P. R. Constructing This Type For Grain and Coal Traffic.

As a result of the success obtained in the use of the two hundred hopper bottom box cars in connection with their grain and coal traffic, the Canadian Pacific Railway are to construct this type of cars in large numbers in the future. The hopper or shute is placed in rear, just inside the side door, and when closed forms a part of the car floor. When it is desired to unload a car into an elevator a pin is driven out, which allows the hopper floor on the side of the car to drop, and about 50 per cent of the load will be run out almost as fast as the elevator can take it away.
