ESTIMATES FOR 1908-9.

Hon. W. S. FIELDING delivered a message from the Governor General, which was read by Mr. Speaker as follows :

GREY.

The Governor General transmits to the House of Commons, estimates of sums required for the service of the Dominion for the year ending March 31, 1909, and in accordance with the provisions of The British North America Act, 1867, the Governor General recommends these estimates to the House of Commons.

On motion of Mr. Fielding, the message of His Excellency, together with the estimates, were referred to the Committee of Supply.

MOTIONS AGREED TO WITHOUT DISCUSSION.

For a statement showing : 1. The amount of each temporary loan made by the government since January 1, 1907.

2. The name of the lenders, date of loan, time or duration, rate of interest.

3. The total amount of current temporary loans outstanding.

4. The total amount borrowed by the government on temporary loans from banks in Canada since March 31, 1907.—Mr. Monk.

For a copy of all orders in council, correspondence, documents and papers relating to Chinese seeking admission to the public schools of British Columbia as students, and relating to the remission of head tax on such persons.—Mr. R. L. Borden.

For a copy of all correspondence, instructions or communications sent by the government of Canada through the Secretary of State or otherwise, to Sir Henri Joly de Lot-
