respect to Ships, Merchandize, and other Effects which might be taken at Sea, viz. * That the said Ships and Merchandize or other Esfects, which may be taken in the Channel and in the North Sea after the Space of twelve Days from the Signature of the Suspension, should be restored reciprocally. That the Term should be six Weeks for Prizes taken from the Channel, the British Seas, and North Seas as far as Cape St. Vincent.

And fix Weeks more from that Cape to the Line, whether in the Ocean or the Mediterranean.

And lastly, six Months beyond the Line, and all other Parts of the World without any Exception, &c.

At Land the Suspension of Arms took place without any Exception, in six Weeks, to be reckoned from the Signature of the Preliminaries. So that if we had at any Time (after the Expiration of the six Weeks, and yet before there was any Possibility of preventing Hostilities in the East-Indies by transmitting Intelligence of what had pass'd at Aix) made
