BY-LAW No. 889.

By-Law to Levy a Certain Amount for County
Buildings Debentures.

Be it enacted a By-Law of the Corporation of
the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and
Glengarry, to levy the amount of \$1625 72 to
meet the annual payment on County Build-
ings Debentures, issued to raise the sum of
twelve thousand dollars, said levy to be
made on the different municipalities of the
