The verious political changes, also, that have occurred in forzign countries since the first publication of the book—sucn as the teunion of Upper and Lower Cenada; the secossion of the Stete of Yucaten from the Mesican Republic; the dissolution of the Peru-Bolivien Confideration; the retrocession of Syris to its former master; the suncestion of part of New Zeeland to the British Empire, and other similar avenus, have all been cerefully noted. In addition to which, such mistakes as here been detected by a close examination of both sections of the work, and which are more or less unavoidable in compliations of this kind, have been thoroughly corrected.
