There would be no delay more than was necessary to check up on these matters. The original estimates for surveys of the N. T. R. had been more than doubled. What reason was there to suppose that this might not prove the case in regard to the Hudson Bay Railway?

Hon. Frank Oliver thought Mr. Cochrane's statement revealed a serious situation which would mean a delay of a month or so, but of one, two or more years. If the minister intended to choose a new route for the railway, it meant entire new surveys.

Hon. Geo. E. Foster declared that the information of the government was that the road was not starting right or going right.

Route Abandoned.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier said his interpretation of Mr. Cochrane's words was that the route determined by the old government was to be abandoned entirely. This meant no release of the order for suspension of the work would be given this winter. It would mean everything had to be started over again.

Hon. Frank Cochrane explained that the route was not starting right or going right.

Premier Borden declared that it was the right and duty of the new government to take reasonable consideration to the route and not to accept it without question as settled by the late government.

Hugh Guthrie (Wellington) declared that the starting point at the Pas was beyond question. The action of the minister of railways meant indefinite delay.

The tenders had been discussed before the election and the contract awarded after the election to the lowest tenderer. The selection of the site had been made by the late government.
