Montreal, April 5 .- (Special.) - Hon Lomer Gouin opened his campaign this evening in St. James' division, and delivered at the same time the program speech of the new Quebec regime. The premier, while advocating eco my and laying down the principle that we should live within out means, said he felt that vigorous aid must be given to public instruction and colonization and to the development of agricultural mining and forestry industries. The portant question of the federal subsidy was one of justice and equity that had been agitating public opinion in Quebec for a quarter of a century, while it had been discussed in the sis-ter provinces before the conference of 1587


