PICKERING, July 9.—(Special.)-The Village of Pickering, situated 22 miles east of Toronto, is a pleasant and cheap place in which to live. One of the prettiest spots on the Kingstonroad has here a population of about With pienty of trees, a 800 people. picturesque river and the Spink Mil's accways, comfortable residences and convenient access to the lake, this forms an ideal place for a summer residence for the business man. The air is baimy and pure. The sur-

rounding country is the best of farm ands, where well-fed Clydesdales, shorthorns, Shropshires and grades graze in contentment. To travel out from the dusty smoky city on the evening train affords a delightful relief from the cobwebs of business and worry and gives the business man a fuller taste of the joy of living. House rents are so high in the city that a person may easily live here, pay rent and railway fare and do it cneaper than in the city. The run is only one hour from the Union Station, which is less than some runs on the Toront; street car lines.

Cheap Living. Living here is well supplied by the obliging merchants of the town at a cheap rate. House rent is low, a good house being secured for \$5 per month. Railway fare, taking advantage of the Rosebank commuted fares, 55 trips for \$6.60-it makes the total journey per month of 25 days cost \$13.10. Add to this the house rent of \$5 and you get an expense of \$18.10. A very poor house or suite of rooms could be obtained in Toronto for this money. And the idea seems to be gaining in favor with the business people. Congestion is not necessary in the big city centres, and if the business men would take advantage of these pleasant spots for their families for the summer at least more contentment would ensug



M'BRIDE NOT CERTAIN

Doesn't Say Positively That He Won't Break Into Federal Politics.

Hon. Richard McBride, the brilliant young premier of British Columbia, arrived from Ottawa yesterday morning and left at noon for the Pacific coast. He is not inclined to credit the despatches from London announcing that Sir Wilfrid Laurier may persuade the government to restore the words "final and unalterable," in the amendment to the B. N. A. Act respecting provincial subsidies.

"I have every assurance," he said "that the bill will stand as modified by the government at our request. Minister Churchill stated this positively on the floor of the house." What was your impression of Winston

"He is a man of most remarkable abli-ity, a far more able man than many of us appreciate, and he is growing and deus appreciate, and he is growing and developing every day. By the way, he is to visit Canada next year."

Mr. McBride went on to say that his fight for British Columbia has been in the interest of every province of Canada. The provincial conference at Ottawa had not agreed that the revision of the provincial subsidies should be final and unalterable. The Dominion Government had vincial subsidies should be final and unal-terable. The Dominion Government had inserted that on its own motion. But had the address gone thru the imperial house as it came from Ottawa, every province would have been tied hand and foot for all time, without regard to any changes that the future might bring forth as to

that the future might bring forth as to its necessities and condition.
"The imperial government was disposed to treat us fairly," said Mr. McBride, "and we carried our point."
Speaking of Canadians prominent in imperial politics, the premier said "I regard Hamar Greenwood, M.P., as the coming man among all the colonial members of parliament. There are others, of course—Bonar Law, another Canadian, is quite prominent—but Greenwood, in my opinion, gives promise of the greatest and the prominent—but Greenwood, in my opinion, gives promise of the greatest future. He will become one of the big figures in English politics."

Mr. McBride is very sanguine as to the future of the Conservative restricts.
