General Petrus Jacobus Joubert, commandant-general of the Transvaal forces,
hetter known as "Slim Peter," was born

fied. In South Africa. He was born sin Cape Colony, but was taken by his parents to the Orange Free State, where he was taught from early childhood to shoot straight and hate the British. Of schooling he had but little, but his ambition prompted him to read the few books he could obtain, and he succeeded in obtaining a fair knowledge of history and languages.

A Burgher and a Fighter.

Soon after the acquisition of Natal by the British he became a burgher of the South African Republic, and a daring fighter. He was so feared by 'the natives that the knowledge that he was at the head of a punitive expedition usually resulted in their surrender. He was elected Vice-President of the Transvaal in 1896, defeated Sir George Colley at Majuba Hill in 1881, and acted as President of the Republic in 1883-34, during Kruger's absence in Enrope.

Always Favored Force.

Gen. Joubert was always in favor of the see of force instead of diplomacy, and President Kruger, on several occasions, had great difficulty in repressing his hor-headed friend and colleague, notably in 1879, when Jonhert, with Kruger and Pretorius, was planning the rebellion, to overthrow British rise in the Transvaal.
