Chicago, March 17.—One of the highest principles of the newspaper profession—that of refusing to betray a confidence refusing to betray a confidence in revealing a source of information—will be brought before the highest court of the country, as the result of the holding in contempt of court here of Hector H. Elwell, city editor of the Chicago American.

Because Mr. Elwell refused to break his word in declining to answer questions concerning the oreak his word in declining to answer questions concerning the source of a news story, put to him by a federal grand jury. Federal Judge George Carpenter fined him \$500 and ordered that he be confined in jail until he answer them. On the request of Mr. Elwell's attorney a stay order of ten days was greated to der of ten days was granted, to perfect an appeal.

"The point involved is so important to newspapers generally that we intend to carry the case to the highest court." said Roy D. Keehn. Mr. Elwell's attorney.
