With Queen City and the Caledonians left for the final in group 5 Toronto is assured a representative in the Tankard finals that will likely be played the week after next. In the other Toronto group, Lindsay proved the winner. Play yesterday took place under perfect conditions, and the curling was easily up to the standard. A fine game was put up by the Peterborough players, who have been altogether without practice owing to the destruction of their rink by fire early in the season.

Doc Roberts stayed at home in Brampton, being a Tankard absentee after participating in the Tankard for a generation back. Did they miss his finger? Look at the score. Even the rooster's feather in the bonnet of the sporting person could not victory. Excelsior home to even one victory.

Several fairly good two-year-olds have been shown at New Orleans and in California this winter. The New York Sun notices Lee Rose, a bay gelding by St. Avelinus-Lavender, who has won his three starts with a "razor" race, is said to be the best youngster seen so far on the coast. Another good performer is "H. Williams" Aplo Ory, by Kinley Mack-La Palma. Ed Corrigan has a fast filly in Anne McGee, by Maria Santa-California, while Elizabeth Hartwood, from the same barn and sired by the same stallion, out of the young English mare Proclaim, has attracted some at the Caledonians. S. C. Henderson has a promising filly in Achieve, by Watercourse-Stellaris, who cost \$900 as a yearling. Perhaps the best two-year-old colt shown at New Orleans is Marse Abe, by Yankee-Halo, owned by L. A. C. He has started four times, won three races and was disqualified in another. Cella also has a swift filly in Lady Leola, by Voted-Dove, together with a heavy filly, Arionette, by Cesarion-Fonsollette, who is a full sister to Col. Bob. The Ormondale Stable has also two shifty colts at Oakland, Woodlander, by Haywood-Orellana, and Duke of Milan, by Orneli-Spinach, a half brother to Las Ormondale. Geo. J. Long also has a classy filly in Arcadia in Chilla, by Alviscot-Sunlight, who has not been unplaced in four starts.

Twenty thoroughbred mares and geldings purchased recently by Lexington were recently shipped to England to be distributed at various European points. The mares are either barren or have never been bred. It is understood that they will be used as hunters, as all are built to carry weight. Nearly all of them were purchased at a price at which they were purchased being \$200. The sires of some of these horses have been bred at Lexington, Goldfinch, Handsome, Prince of Penance, Maceo, Inverness and Grifion.

Alfred Shrubbs, the great little English runner, who sailed for home yesterday, had been with us for eight months, and in that time cleaned up close to \$5000 in his races in this country and the United States. Shrubbs announces that after arranging business affairs in his home town in England he would return to America to race in the spring, where he will locate permanently with his family.

Attention is drawn to the notice of the annual Canadian amateur boxing championships that are to take place in Massey Hall next month. Following the precedent set in many countries, notably in England, the governing union is conducting the competition itself, a fact which should warrant the success of the undertaking.

Jack Johnson's old fighting partner, Joe Jeannette, has just won a real battle. In a win-up at one of the New York clubs Monday, he knocked out Jim Jeffords in the second round. In the opening round Jeannette used a left jab to the face. Jeffords tried to box cleverly in the second round, but Jeannette landed a right swing on the giant's jaw and Jeffords was unable to continue. If Jeannette keeps up the good work with his record of one win and three draws in five battles with Johnson, he should be in line for a match with Burns.

Following in the footsteps of the heavyweights, Sullivan and Kilrain, the rival waterweights, Matty Matthews and Rubie Ferns, will tour the country together giving a fighters' act on the stage. They met several times for a title, finally Ferns scoring a clean knockout in their last meeting in the Mutual-street rink on May 24, 1931.

Bill Squires, the Australian pugilist, who has been knocked out three times since his arrival in California, and has earned \$7000 thereby, started from U. S. coast to visit New York more than a week ago, but has not reached his destination. Squires has been seen at a Philadelphia boxing club. It would be rather odd if Squires got a match with Jack Johnson, who is simply pining for a fight with anybody just now. Johnson went all the way to Australia last winter to get a crack at Squires, who was considered a world-beater then, but the latter dodged the big negro with the excuse that he had agreed to go to America to fight Jeffries, Burns or O'Brien. So Johnson lost a chance to knock Squires out in a few punches. Burns, a year has elapsed and Squires is now ready to ask a fight. Somebody who will knock him out—with a good loser's end to the purse.
