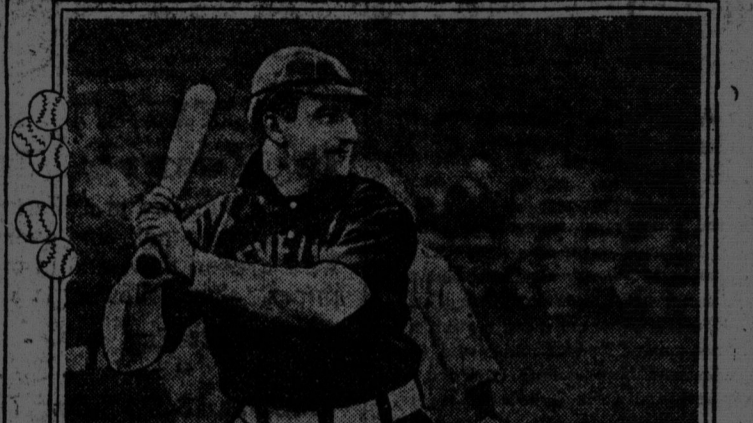
Marblehead, Mass., July 16.—Lieutenant Alexander L. Pfitzer, dependent because he had failed to master the art of flying, committed suicide here by shooting himself and then throwing himself into the water of the bay. His body has not been recovered.

Pfitzer's life is the eighteenth given up to the science of aviation. That he did not lose his in some of the attempts he has made and which ended disastrously is remarkable. He had many falls and in none of them was he seriously injured.

Another occasion he requested the photographers to take a picture of his wreck. "But that I will ever want it," said he, "but it is right that future generations should know what we have gone through."
