PERLEY SAYS CRITICISM BY SOME OFFICERS NOT TO BE TAKEN TOO SERIOUSLY

London, April 17.—(Canadian Associated Press).—At a Canadian Club luncheon, Sir George Perley spoke of "a few dissatisfied officers who had returned to Canada and had been finding fault." He added that such criticisms should not be taken too seriously, for "no wise man could claim that some things might not have been done better," but when the history of the war came to be written it would be shown that Canada had played its part both in a courageous and efficient manner. Sir Edward Kemp announced that by the end of April one half of the Canadian troops will have been repatriated, amounting to about 180,000 men who were overseas when the armistice was concluded. The second division will embark in May and by the end of July most of the troops will be back in Canada.

WASHINGTON WARNING HALTS N. Y. STRIKE

Armistice Until Saturday Agreed on—Use War Vessels to Keep Traffic Moving
Washington, April 17.—Transports will be escorted in and out of New York harbor if it requires the entire United States navy, it was stated officially yesterday in connection with plans of harbor workers to start a strike to tie up traffic completely. A forty-eight hour "armistice" postponing the strike was agreed upon yesterday following a statement that the war department, the navy department and the United States Shipping Board "would not tolerate a strike."

BLANQUET KILLED

Evidence of Revolution Against the Carranza Government
Mexico City, April 17.—(By the Associated Press).—General Aureliano Blanquet, war minister in President Huerta's cabinet, who recently was reported to have landed in the Vera Cruz region to start a revolution against the Carranza government, was killed yesterday in a light near Chavacilla village, according to press reports from Vera Cruz. He was seventy-one years old. New York, April 17.—Advices from representatives of General Felix Diaz, Mexican revolutionary leader, announce that an intensive campaign of revolutionary troops is taking place in the states of Chiapas, Tabasco, Vera Cruz, Puebla, and Michoacan, preliminary to a general offensive against the Carranza forces.

AGREEMENT ENDS MONTREAL STRIKE

Montreal, April 17.—The strike of the Montreal Light, Heat and Power Company employees came to a close yesterday afternoon, with a vote accepting an agreement between the company and its employees. The company recognized the principle of the employers dealing with employees through unions, the principle of the eight hour day and agrees to an arrangement of rates of pay and working conditions by committees composed of heads of departments and representatives of employees of the departments involved.

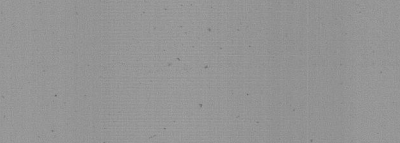

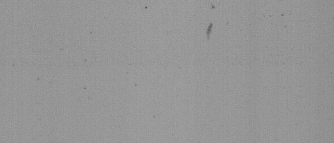
