

Philadelphia, Sept. 12—A Philadelphia aviator is the first man accused of smugging by the air route. Buffalo, N. Y., Sept. 12—That Norman W. Shear and Miss Mary Messner, his fiancee, murdered in the Ensminger road near Buffalo late on Sunday night, may have been shot when they resisted a new type of "badger" game, was a new theory developed by Sheriff Bradley and his deputies today. According to information gathered by the sheriff, there have been at least four hold-ups of couples on roads in the vicinity in the past two weeks.
