COALITION HAD 51 LEAD LAST NIGHT London, Dec. 9.—More than two-thirds, or over 400 members of the new house of political parties stand practically as they were at the dissolution of parliament. The Unionists who last week expected to gain at least twenty seats, thus far gained but three. The standing of the parties tonight:

Lord Charles Bessford, Elected. Austen Chamberlain, Unopposed. A meeting with blood streaming from his head and face, serious disturbances occurred at Belfast tonight. The streets were full of political paraders and crowds of roughs resorted to stone throwing. Hundreds of windows were broken and many persons were injured. It required the efforts of the entire city police to keep a semblance of order.
