family or who is male over 18 years of age,
may homestead a quarter section of avail-
able Dominion land in Manitoba, Sas-
katchewan, or Alberta. The applicant must
appear in person at the Dominion Lands
Agency or Sub-Agency for the district.
Entry (including) the time required to earn
homesteaded patent and cultivate fifty
acres extra.
