THE PRODUCTION OF COAL OIL IN SCOT 1.4ND -The abundance and cheapness of American tetroleum have not seriously depressed the oroduction of coal oil in Scotland There are in that country 68 oil works, which consume in the year 782.000 tons shale or biruminous cord and produce 21,850,000 gal-lons of cil for lamps, 5,000 tons of paratine, and 600 tons of sulphate of ammonia. Formerly the coal used to yield 120 gollans of crude oil to the ton, but the supply of that quality is exhaust d, and shales are now work ed which yield not more than from tifteen to 35 gallons per ten.
