CHEAP FUEL

A Wood Lot Should be Preserved on Every Fair-Sized Farm.

The wood lot properly kept up is no luxury, but a paying investment, not only on account of the firewood and lumber obtainable from it, but as a shelter for the rest of the farm.

A traveller on the country roads fully appreciates a sheltering belt of trees in winter, and as the farmer himself is the most frequent passer on these roads, he might take this fact into consideration before removing all forest growth from his farm.

Coal rises in price every year, and to be independent of this kind of fuel the farmer must conserve his bush. A few acres kept for this purpose alone will pay better than the same land in crop if clearing is added to the other expenses of preparation for seeding
