RE: Harry SEYMOUR, (Indian) Stoney Indian Reserve, Chilcotin, B.C. District - Wanted for Murder. Asstce; B.C. Provincial Police.

HEADQUARTERS

1. The above named Indian is wanted by the B.C. Provincial Police for the murder of Mrs Johnny Baptiste (Indian Woman) on February 11th, 1934 at Whitewater Lake in the Chilcotin, B.C. District.

SUB-DIVISION

2. For a number of years following this crime the Provincial Police have made every effort to locate Seymour and to effect his arrest, also have run down the many rumours regarding his whereabouts, but without result.

DETACHMENT

3. On Aug. 5th, 1944 at Williams Lake, B.C. one Tommy Alphonse (my Indian confidential informant) came to me with information that Seymour was alive and believed to be hiding out on the Trap Line of Bob Mikelson, in the Prince George, B.C. District and further that Mikelson was furnishing seymour with food and other supplies and disposing of his fur for him.

5. On August 24th, 1944 at Williams Lake, B.C. Tommy Alphonse and myself together with members of the Provincial Police were interviewed by T.W.S.Parsons, Com. B.C.P.P. regarding the above information, he was very much interested and instructed that Tommy Alphonse be employed to further mingle with the Chilcotin Indians with a view of getting further information and if possible confirm what he has already reported. Plans for forther action are being formulated depending on further information from Alphonse.
