LOVERS TIED STONES ON THEIR FEET; WADED INTO THE RIVER """

A Wealthy Italian Who Has Escaped Punishment for Murder --- Russian Lady, Who Converted a Spy, Sulcides at Florence.

ROME, May 4.—An interesting romance of crime in connection with the San Francisco earthquake was revealed when it was found that among the members of the Italian colony at the time of the earthquake was a certain Signor Riccomini of Lucca, who escaped from Italy in 1837 and when the court of Assize was going to sentence him to lifelong penal servitude as the murder of two carbineers. The researches then made by the police to trace him were fruitless. The sentence was pronounced on March 27, 1887. Riccomini's whereabouts having been discovered in California in connection with the stories of the earthquake the Italian authorities hastened to ask for his extradition before the term of 20 years fixed for legal prescription had expired. The extradition was, however, refused, it was reported here through the influence exerted by Riccomini who is noa millionaire. Now that the 20 years has expired and the sentence cannot even be carried out Riccomini announces his approaching arrival in Italy to see his wife and children whom he left before giving them any news at the time lest the police should discover his place of refuge.


