New York, Aug. 8.—The Rev. Dr. Daniel Bliss, founder and president emeritus of Syrian Protestant College in Beirut, Syria, and one of the most noted missionaries of the east, died on July 28, at his home in Beirut, according to news reaching this city. He was in his ninety-third year and had been a missionary in Syria for more than sixty years. Dr. Bliss was born in Georgia, Vermont, and was graduated from Amherst College in 1852.




