### OBITUARY

**John O'Neill.**  
Shortly after one o'clock yesterday  
afternoon the death took place of John  
O'Neill, 109 Elliott Row, following a  
stroke of paralysis on Wednesday eve-  
ning. The deceased was about 72  
years of age and head of the firm of  
O'Neill Bros., the well known meat  
dealers, City Market. He is survived  
by six sons and three daughters, Harry  
J. Arthur P. Frank T. J. Herbert,  
L. Gerald and Ernest V. Florence,  
Gerrit and Kathleen, who is a nurse  
at St. Vincent's Convent, Cliff  
street.  
Mr. O'Neill was an active business  
man and popular citizen, and a fa-  
miliar figure at the City Market,  
where he conducted successfully a  
large trade for many years. For a long  
time he was an active member of  
the Irish Literary and Benevolent So-  
ciety. His many friends were shocked  
to learn of his death as he was  
about the city the first of the week  
in apparently good health.
