WHOLESALE ARRESTS **QUIETING STRIKERS**

IN GERMANY Miners Are Everywhere Returning to Their Work-Spartacan Leaders Being

Berlin, Tuesday, May 1.—(By the Associated Press)— The general strike in upper Stiesia is coming to an end, the Government having arrested the principal Spartacan agitators. The miners everywhere are returning to work. In Bremen the situation also has improved with the arrest of a majority of the Spartacans who have been terrorizing the city. Government troops stormed Spartacan headquarters in Hamburg, and arrested sixty of the leaders. They captured many bundles and boxes of plunder, including jewelry, shoes and military stores.

LLOYD GEORGE GOV'T LOSES ANOTHER **SEAT IN COMMONS**

This Makes the Third Flop Since Parliament Was Elected in December.

London, April 80.—The coalition government of Premier Lloyd George has lost another seat in the House of Commons, its third in four by-elections since parliament was elected in December, in the victory in the central district of Aberdeen and Kincardine of Major M. Wood, a Jaberal. Major Wood defeated the coalition Unionist and Labor candidates. The vote was: Major Wood, 4,970; Mr. Davidson, Coalitionist, 4,764; Mr. Duncan, Laborite, 3,942.

Major Wood contested Ayr in the December elections and was defeated by more than 5,000 votes by Sir George Younger, Coalitionist.

In the December election the central district of Aberdeen and Kincardine was carried by Lieut-Col. A. T. Gordon, by 838 votes out of a total of more than 12,000 over J. M. Henderson, Liberal.

REDS OBTAIN VICTORY OVER THE TROOPS OF KOLCHAK

Eight Regiments Were Wiped Out and More Than 1,500

Prisoners Were Captured. London, May 1.—Another Russian twireless, official, says that along the Salmysch river, northwest of Orentburg, the Reds "obtained a complete victory over Admiral Kolchak's Fourth Army Corps," wiping out eight regiments, and capturing more than 1,500 prisoners. The general in command of the Siberian Fifth Division also was captured. The Bolshevik statement adds:

"The bank of the Salmysch are covered with bodies. More than six hundred have been counted. Many of the enemy were hurled into the river by bayonet thrusts."

OFFICERS AND CREW LOST WITH TUG

U. S. Naval Tug Goes Down off the Coast of France.

Builetin—Washington, May 1.—The officers and fourteen men of the crew of the naval tug Gypsum Queen were drowned when that vessel struck a rock and sank near Arwen light, on the coast of France, on April 28, while returning to Brest after assisting a fleet of mine sweepers in distress.
