

A resolution was unanimously adopted recommending that in return for 10,000 cubic feet of water per second from Lake Michigan for the canal project the United States should join Canada in a treaty providing for free and uninterrupted navigation between both countries on the Great Lakes and connections. Canada now enjoys free navigation on Lake Michigan and those portions of the great lakes that belong to the United States but it is received as a privilege and not as a right and may be terminated at any time.
