M., June, 1853, Nancy Leonard, dau. of Stephen H. Moore, Esq. Barrister, a descendant of the celebrated General Sir John Moore. Is Lieut.-Col. of the 68th "Kings" Batt. of Volunteer Infantry, a mem. of the Council of the Dominion Rifle Association, and agent at Kentville for the Bank of Nova Scotia. First returned to Parlt. for present seat, May, 1870, on the death of his father; re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal, and a supporter of the present Govt.—*Kentville, N.S.*
