WILLSON, CROWELL. [*East Middlesex,*]

S. of the late Lieut.-Col. Benjamin Willson, J.P., of the Co. Elgin, Ont. B. near St. Thomas, Ont., March, 1815. Ed. at the Hamilton District School. M., May, 1843, Miss Maria Jackson. Is Presdt. of the Agricultural Mutual Assurance Association of Can., and Major 2nd Batt. Middlesex Militia. Sat for Middlesex in L. A. Can., then comprising the present counties of Elgin and Middlesex, from 1851 to 1854, and for East Middlesex, from g. e. 1863, until the Union. Returned to Commons at last g. e. A Conservative, and a supporter of Sir J. A. Macdonald.—*Arva, Ont.*

WOOD, Hon. EDMUND BURKE. [*South Brant.*]

S. of Mr. Samuel Wood, of Co. Halton, Ont., who came to Can. from the U. S. during the war of 1812. B. near Chippawa, Ont., 14 Feb. 1817. Ed. at Oberlin College, Ohio, U. S., where he graduated in 1848. M., April, 1855, Jane Augusta, second dau. of Dr. Peter Martin, of Brantford. Called to the Bar, U. C., Trinity Term, 1854. Was first Clerk of the County Court and Clerk of
