Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That so much of an Act, made in the Tenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, as relates to the regulating the Fees of the Officers of the Customs in America, and for extending the same to the Naval Officers there, which was to be in Force from the First Day of August, One thousand seven hundred and seventy, for the Term of Two Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament; and which was, by Three Acts, made in the Twelfth, Fourteenth, and Nineteenth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, further continued until the First Day of August, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-two, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament; shall be, and the same is hereby further continued from the Expiration thereof until the First Day of August, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-six, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.

II. And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That so much of an Act, made in the Sixteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for allowing the Exportation of certain Quantities of Wheat, and other Articles, to His Majesty's Sugar Colonies in *America*, and to the Island of *Saint Helena*, and to the other Settlements belonging to the United Company of Merchants of *England* trading to the *East Indies*, and of Biscuit and Pease to *Newfoundland*, *Nova Scotia*, *Bay Chaleur*, and *Labrador*; and for indemnifying all Persons with respect to advising or carrying into Execution His Majesty's Orders of Council already made for allowing the Exportation of Wheat, and other Articles; as relates to allowing the Exportation of certain Quantities of Wheat, and other Articles, to His Majesty's Sugar Colonies in *America*, which was to continue in Force until the First Day of January, One thousand seven hundred and seventy-seven; and which, by several Acts, made in the Seventeenth, Eighteenth, Nineteenth, Twentieth, Twenty-
