BILL.

An Act to give relief to persons who may refuse or be unwilling from alleged conscientious motives to be sworn.

WHEREAS it is expedient to grant relief to persons who may refuse Preamble. or be unwilling, from alleged conscientious motives, to be sworn in Civil or Criminal proceedings, or to take any oath of allegiance or 5 as to the discharge of future duty: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

1. In any case in which an oath is required by law to be administer - Affirmation ed to any person called as a witness, in any Court of Civil or Criminal maybe made 10 Jurisdiction, or in which an affidavit or deposition shall be necessary to in certain

- 10 Jurisdiction, or in which an affidavit or deposition shall be necessary to in cer be made by any person in the course of any Civil or Criminal proceed cases. ing, or in which an eath of allegiance or as to the discharge of future duty shall be required to be taken by any person in this Province, if such person shall refuse or be unwilling from alleged conscientious mo-
- 15 tives to be sworn, it shall be lawful for the Court or Judge, or other presiding officer, or person qualified to take affidavits or depositions or to administer oaths, upon being satisfied of the sincerity of such objections, to permit such person instead of being sworn to make his or her solemn affirmation or declaration in the words following, that is to
- 20 say.—I, A. B., do solemnly and truly affirm and declare that the taking of any oath is, according to my religious belief, unlawful; and I do also solemnly and truly affirm and declare [or promise and declare] &c: which solemn affirmation or declaration shall be of the same force and effect as if such person had taken an oath in the usual form.

If any person making such solemn affirmation or declaration shall Withity fulse wilfully, falsely and corruptly affirm or declare any matter or thing affirmation which, if the same had been sworn in the usual form, would have perjury. amounted to wilful and corrupt perjury, every such person so offending shall incur the same penalties, as by the laws and Statutes in force in
- 80 this Province are or may be enacted or provided against persons convicted of wilful and corrupt perjury.
