The lands alienated without purchase consist of grants to persons legally entitled thereto, as militia claimants, U. E. loyalists, discharged soldiers, sailors and pensioners, and to emigrants who had received orders of location previous to the introduction of the system of sale, but who had not previously received the lands to which they had then become entitled. To military and naval officers a remission of part of the purchase-money is allowed, on a scale fixed according to rank and service.
