Uplands, Ontario	7th May 1943	(cont'd)	J20564 Pilot Officer H.O. Farnor, with R67518 LAC Bradley, J.B. as student, struck wires while carrying out unauthorized low flying. C-1 category. Site of incident - 100 miles N.W. of Main Aerodrome in the vicinity of the Gattineau Hills. No injury.	
	7th May 1943		R179921 LAC Green, W.E. failed to apply sufficient correction for drift when landing Harvard 2781. Aircraft swung to starboard and ground looped. C-2 category. No injury. Main Aerodrome.	
	8th May 1943		Cloudy to overcast. Rain in some localities.	
	9th May 1943		Partly cloudy. R179921 LAC Green, W.E. swung Harvard 3014 on landing. Failed to take proper corrective measures and aircraft ground looped. C-1 category. No injury. Main Aerodrome. Protestant Church service was conducted by Squadron Leader Davis, A.F.H.Q. Padre. Very well attended service.	
	10 May 1943		Overcast. GB1458908 LAC Hofman, O.G.A., while landing Harvard 2831, stalled aircraft in from 20 feet. Aircraft bounced and landed while turning. Groundlooped, damaging both oleos, port main plane and propeller. C-2 category. No injury. Main Aerodrome. Meeting of Dramatic Club directed by P/O Higgins, Adjutant, Maintenance Wing, and was attended by a large number of airwomen and a smaller number of airmen. It was decided to curtail club intentions of producing a play until the Fall, in view of so many outdoor activities in the summer. Meetings will however be held at intervals in order to maintain interest in dramatics. Flying continued all day.	
	11 May 1943		Overcast. Rain in afternoon. Flying all morning, but washed out in the afternoon.	
	12 May 1943		Overcast. Intermittent rain in some localities. Clearing. Course #73 held their Wings Dinner in the Officers' Mess, followed by a dance in the Recreation Hall, about 200 members of the course and their guests being present. Music was supplied by the RCAF Station, Rockcliffe, Entertainment Unit, and a performance of magic was given by AC2 Denis Thyme of the same Station.
