

conclusion, in reference to the matter, it only served still further to complicate the transactions, as instead of shewing distinctly the Cheques paid during each month, and the balance at the end of the month, it contained no dates, and the only balance given was that at the end of January. There were also included Cheques which must have been drawn in February; and as your Statements were brought down to the 31st December, it is quite impossible under the circumstances to verify the balances given by you.

It will be necessary, to admit of a proper examination of the transactions, for the
