Ottawa, 25th. April, 1905.

Rev.Sir:

With reference to your letter of 30th.ultime,
I beg to inform you that Mr. Agent Sims reports that when
he heard from the License Inspector that Mr. Randolph
Boyter was prepared to furnish evidence that one Frank
Price of the Mansion House had sold liquor to an Indian
named Cuckoo of Sagamuk, he instructed Mr. J. E. Smith, Dominion Constable to investigate and to institute proceedings at once in the event of securing evidence to justify
such course.

Mr. Smith reported that after investigation he failed to secure evidence to justify prosecution and that Mr. Boyter said that he was intoxicated when he made the charge and could not substantiate it upon oath.

Under the circumstances it is not apparent that the Agent was in a position to do anything further in the matter.
