- Fig. 12 Button, silver, of officer's tunic, N. S. Militia, 1868. Mayflower design with crown above, surrounded by "Nova Scotia Militia." (E. M. H. Vieth).
- Fig. 13 Belt buckle, officer's, silter, 1868. Mayflower design (leaves badly formed), surmounted by crown, circle inscribed "Nova Scotia Militia," (E. M. H. Vieth.). Some belt buckles had hook ("snake") fastening.
