Ali Baba (ä'lē bā'bā): a character in the "Arabian Nights."
allies (properly, āl-līz', but here accented on the first syllable for the sake of the rhyme): (1) friends; (2) those united to us by treaty.

ancient (ān'shent) **ages**: olden times.

apace (ā-pās'): quickly, soon.

apparrelled (ăp-păr'rēld): dressed.

arrant (ăr'rant): shameless.

Babylon (băb'ŷ-lŭn): an ancient eastern city, now in ruins.

balusters (băl'ŭs-tērz): the stair-rail.

barrow (băr'rō): wheel-barrow.

bazaar (bā-zār'): in eastern lands a market-place or collection of shops.

bewild'ring (bē-wīl'drīng): confusion, excitement.

billow (bīl'lō): a big wave.

blink (blīnk): to look with half-shut eyes.

Bogie (bō'gĭ): a hobgoblin, a ghost.

bound (bound): held a prisoner.

bramble (brām'b'l): a prickly shrub.

breach (brēch): a break.

brink (brīnk): edge of a steep place, bank of a river.

brittle (brī't'l): easily broken.

broom (brōom): a plant having large yellow flowers, from the twigs of which brooms and brushes are made.

by (bī): near, close at hand.

caravan (kăr'ā-văn): a company of people traveling together.

cavern (kăv'ērŭ): a large cave.

clamber (klăm'bēr): to climb.

cock (kōk): (1) to wink; (2) to put on one side.

cockatoo (kōk-a-too'): a parrot-like bird.

counterpane (koun'tēr-păn): a covering for a bed.

crocodile (krōk'ō-dīl): a huge reptile.

crook (krōok): the staff of a shepherd.
