CHINESE ARE NEUTRA

China's Reply to Russia Says Ne Japs in Northern Army.

it There Are Several Translators in the neat School At Pactingly. Whe, However, Were All Engaged China Considers Russia Has Violated

Washington, D. C., Jan. 25.—Chia's answer to the American Gov-

Washington, D. C., Jan. 25.—China's answer to the American Government's communication calling actention to the charges that the Chinacse were violating neutrality was delivered to United States Secretary of State Hay at his residence yesterday by Sir Chentung Liang Cheng, the Chinese Minister. It will later be sent to the President. Until the Chinese answer has been read by the President its text is withheld, but the Associated Press has obtained an approved synopsis of the note. Regarding the charge that the Chinese bandits are enlisted in the Japanese army, the Chinese Government calls attention to the fact that they were enlisted first by the Russiahs as frontier guards, and fought against the Japanese.

"We find no Japanese officers in our northern army at all. We defind it the Government school in Paotinglu, several Jupanese translators. All of them, however, had been engaged before the war. They are on the same footing as Russians and other foreigners in educational institutions throughout the Empire. Chinfin further regards this as a matter of internal administration of which no other Government has cause to complain."

an other Government has cause to complain."
Regarding the iron ore said to have been furnished the Japanese army, the answer says this ore is from certain mines owned by Chinese merchants, separate from the Government mines at Hangyang. The transactions are not recognized by the Chinese Government. The Matac Islands are said to have been used by the Japanese as a base for their navy. The Chinese Government for the past year has stationed the swift cruiser Halki to watch this island, and no sign, of any landing of Japanese has been reported to the Government. Regarding the articles of contraband alleged to have been sent to Dalny, the answer says, ships have left Che Foo with the knowledge of the Chinese Government for Dalny, and no clearance papers for that port has been issued by the Chinese custom officials.

Regarding the Ryshetelni incident it is stated that the seizure was as unexpected by the Chinese Government did everything it could against such seizure. The Chinese Government did everything it could against such
