

Park, in the midst of grounds well laid off. From the Cupola of the building, a magnificent prospect can be obtained of the harbor and surrounding country. The interior is excellently adapted for educational purposes. The corridors are wide and lofty, and the study halls, recreation rooms and dormitories are on the most convenient and improved plans. There is ample accommodation within its walls for about 200 pupils. There are generally more than 12 ladies of the Congregation of Notre Dame in attendance at this institution. The branches taught are English, French, Mathematics, plain and fancy needle work, Drawing, Painting and Music.

ST. PATRICK'S SCHOOL.

This school, three stories high, stands on Queen Square, at the corner of Great George and Richmond Streets. It is under the care of the Christian Brothers, and has a very large attendance of pupils, the average being over 300. There are three grade departments in the school, each under the care of a Brother. The ordinary branches in English, Arithmetic and Mathematics are taught. The upper story is occupied by a spacious hall, which is frequently used for concerts, lectures and public meetings.

ST. JOSEPH'S SCHOOL.

This school, for girls, is in charge of the ladies of the Congregation of Notre Dame. It is situated on Pownal Street. The attendance is over 200. The usual branches are taught. The building in which the school is held was at one time St. Andrew's Church, and was brought to its present situation on the ice from St. Andrews, a distance of 20 miles.

COMMERCIAL COLLEGE,

is situated at the corner of King and Queen Streets, in Welsh & Owen's brick building. All branches connected with a first-class business education taught. No vacation. Masters and Mates prepared for the Marine Board Examinations. T. B. Reagh, Principal.
