

DISCOVERY OF LAKE CHAMPLAIN.

Plattsburg, N. Y., July 4.—The tercentenary of the discovery of Lake Champlain was opened here to-day with religious services in all the churches.

Never before in the history of the Champlain Valley, perhaps never in the annals of the Roman Catholic Church in America, has there been such a beautiful, impressive, inspiring ceremony as that which took place on those shaded lawns.

His Eminence, Cardinal Gibbons, presided. The celebrant was the Right Rev. Thomas F. Hickey, D. D., Bishop of Rochester, N. Y.

The three deacons preparing for ordination to the priesthood are to be appointed assistants at the following places: Rev. P. Hickey at St. Mary's cathedral; Rev. P. Padden at Walkerton, and Rev. A. Capps at St. Basil's church, Brantford.

The diocesan retreat for the clergy will take place at St. Jerome's college, Berlin, opening on Monday, July 26, and closing on the following Saturday.

St. Joseph's Hospital, London. On the last day of June took place at St. Joseph's hospital a very interesting function, the occasion being the graduation exercises of twelve nurses who had completed their studies.

Among those present were Rev. J. T. Aylward, Rector of St. Peter's Cathedral, who acted as chairman; Father Lowry, Ford, O'Neill, McKean, West, Quinlan, Tobin and Valentin and Mrs. Williams and Williams. Father Tobin made a very eloquent opening address giving hearty welcome to all present and congratulating the graduates upon their success.

St. Joseph's hospital, London, is one of the most remarkable institutions of the kind in the province of Ontario. Not many years ago, with small beginnings, it began its career as a refuge for the poor, with prudent management and a whole-hearted solicitude for the unfortunate committed to its care, it has now assumed large proportions. EX-PRESIDENT MAY VISIT NUN.

Mr. Editor.—An article published in your issue of June 26, title as above, states that the entire Uganda Mission is supported by the New York archdiocese; and that according to the last published statistics there are 27,200 Catholics and 12,500 Catechumens in Uganda, all under Bishop Hanlon.

This statement would naturally lead to conclude that the entire Uganda Mission is conducted by Bishop Hanlon of the Mill Hill Fathers, and that Uganda contains but the said number of Catholics and Catechumens. This needs to be rectified.

The truth is that there are two societies of Catholic missionaries in Uganda, viz., the White Fathers who founded the Uganda mission in 1899, and the Mill Hill Fathers who arrived in Uganda in 1896. This latter Uganda often gives rise to confusion. There is the Kingdom of Uganda, composed of the provinces of Uganda proper and several other neighboring Kingdoms. Out of the seventeen provinces of Uganda proper, sixteen are within the territory allotted to the White Fathers. There are two Vicariates Apostolic in the Uganda Protectorate, viz., the Northern Nyanza mission, entrusted to the White Fathers, under Bishop Hanlon, Rubaga and Nambaya are their respective sees.

Kindly Remembered. On July 2nd the congregation of St. Joseph's Church, Hamilton, presented an address and a purse containing \$30 in gold to Rev. J. P. Holden who has been transferred to Paris. Rev. Father Walsh, who has been transferred from St. Patrick's Church to Acton, was also presented with \$30 in gold.

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Million Dollars Deposits Gained by Home Bank

Toronto, June 30th. The annual meeting of The Home Bank of Canada was held at the head office, 8 King Street west, yesterday afternoon. The statement submitted for the fiscal year ending May 31st, 1909, showed that deposits had increased, roughly, \$1,000,000; the reserve has been maintained at a sum equal to one-third of the paid up capital; dividends have been paid at the rate of 6 per cent. per annum, quarterly; nearly \$56,000 have been carried forward into the Profit and Loss Account for next year.


