(Special Dispatch.) LONDON, April 25. The season, which is likely to be brilliant, made an early commencement with the opening of the Royal Opera House on Monday.

The Royal Academy opens at the beginning of May and is an event influencing the movements of many county families who time their arrival in town for the private view.

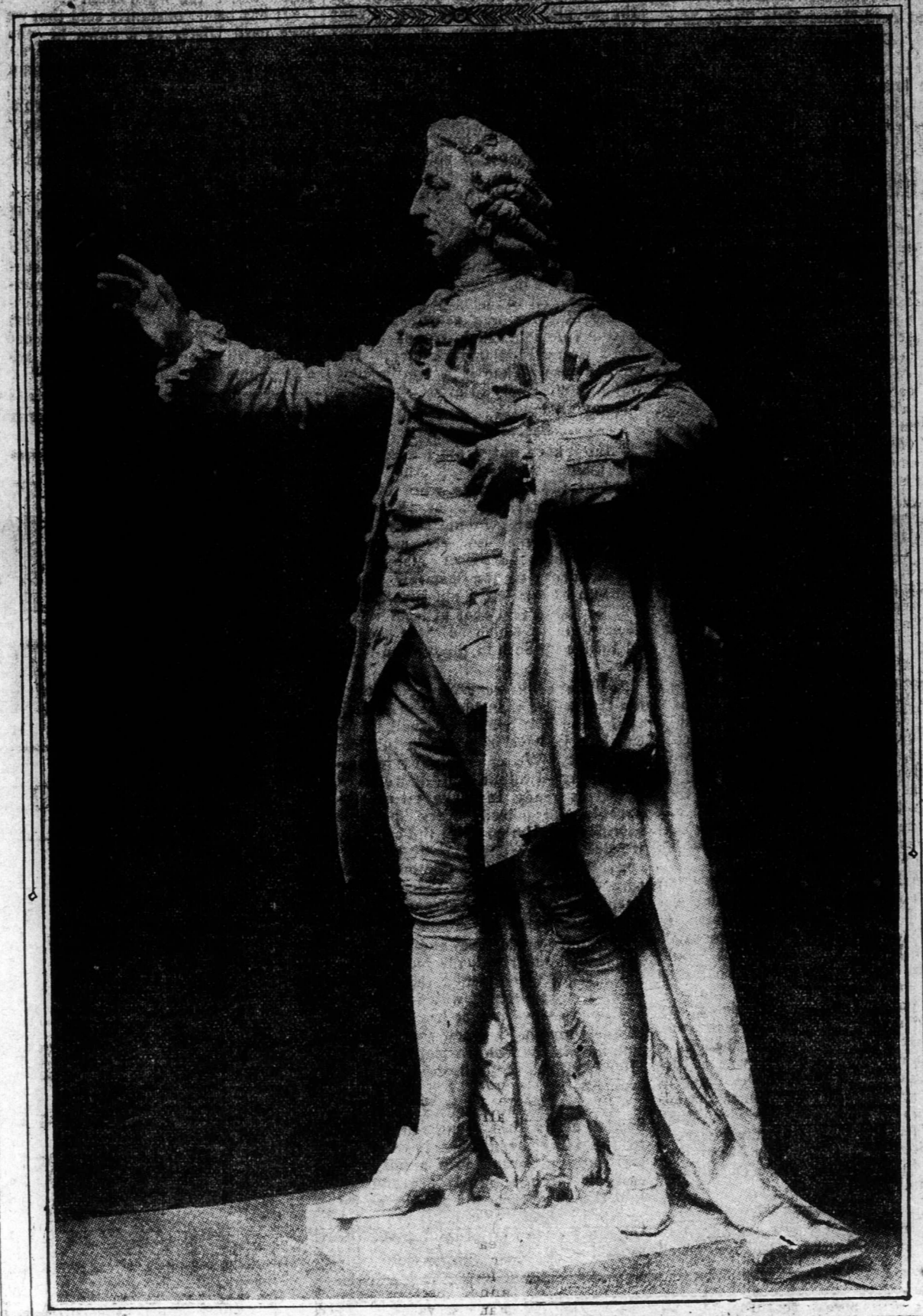

PROFESSOR BERGONIÉ, of Bordeaux, according to the Lancet, has invented a species which may have come from a few primitive forms which, under the action of light, underwent numerous transformations and engendered a multitude of varieties responsible for diseases known to science.

Particulars of the discovery have been communicated to the Académie des Sciences by Dr. Roux, the director of the Pasteur Institute.

The members of the academy are unanimous regarding the capital importance of the discovery, not only from a practical standpoint, as showing the way to efficacious treatment of a malignant disease, but also as opening up an entirely new field of investigation in the history and evolution of the many species of bacteria and the diseases due to them.
