

### THE NEW GOSPEL TRAINS.

The Chicago, Rock Island & Pacific is unning an agricultural demonstration train of six cars over its lines in Arkan

A special "good roads" train is being perated by the St. Louis and San Franeises on an itinerary which will cover the entire system. The train consists f four cars carrying exhibits of models of road construction and the lecturers who will demonstrate them. The progress of the train is being widely advertised throughout the territory served by the Frisco, and every effort is being made to attract large audiences and impress upon them the importance of good roads. Over three hundred stops have been

cheduled. The Louisiana State University is running a "farmers' demonstration train" over the railways of the State, which consists of ten ears, the longest train of the kind which we remember to have heard of. Co-operating with the univer-sity are the State Agricultural College, the State Board of Health, the State Board of Education, and the United States Department of Agriculture. Be-sides the animals and farm exhibits, there is a school exhibit and a general health exhibit. This train makes comparatively long stoos, the schedule over the Vicksburg, Shreveport and Pacific providing in most cases for only three owns a day.
