One Man Dead—Three Narrowty Escape.

Fort William, June 24.—A catastrophe happened at Loch Lomond water supply tunnel yesterday morning. One man is dead, one is seriously injured, and three more were restored to consciousness. They were going to their work in the shaft, which is being sunk for opening the tunnel through the mountain in connection with the waterworks. The fumes of the material used for blasting are driven out by an air compressor, but the six men, who work below the surface, went into the shaft too soon after the blast and were overcome by the fumes. John Pollo, sub-foreman, undertook to give the alarm, and fell from a ladder, breaking his arm, and injuring his back. The dead man is Joseph Chichester, a young Englishman. Three others were overcome, but the men on top of the ground succeeded in getting them.
